



## GRANT INSIGHTS

The **Flood Mitigation Assistance Grant Program** is meant to reduce or eliminate risk of reoccurring flood damage to building and structures insured under the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) aligned with the agency's 2022-2026 strategic plan—by removing barriers to funding agency programs through a people-first approach, to achieve equitable outcomes for those served, and build a climate-resilient nation. Funding is appropriated through the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA).

<b>Eligible Applicants</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>· States</li> <li>· U.S. territories</li> <li>· Tribal governments (Federally recognized)</li> </ul> <p>*Local government entities (cities, counties, towns, special districts) can apply as a subapplicant but must do so through their state, territory, or Federally recognized tribe.</p>





<b>Special Considerations</b>	All applicants and subapplicants <b>must</b> be participating in the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) and <b>are not</b> withdrawn, on probation, or suspended; they <b>must</b> have a Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA)-approved mitigation plan by the application deadline and at the time of award obligation; and in order to be eligible for technical assistance awards, applicant <b>must</b> have received an award through this program in FY21 of at least \$1M. Priority will be given to projects involving properties in areas with higher Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) social vulnerability index scores.
